The most important duty of parents is to share their faith in God with their children. God wants all children to come to know and love Him as a loving God. Parents begin to teach their children about faith by living out their own faith. To know and love God prayer is essential. Two people in a marriage will not know each other unless they talk to one another. In the same way we will not know God unless we talk to Him and listen to Him in our hearts. The duty of parents is to teach their children how to talk to God and listen to him in prayer. The best way to teach children how to pray is to pray with them.

An important aspect of prayer can be having sacred spaces. It is true that God is everywhere and we can speak to Him anywhere. Yet there is something about us humans is that we are people of habits and spaces. We instinctively want to have a sacred space that we gather as a community. Often it does not take long for us to find a certain spot within that church that we go to most of the time. We simply become comfortable with certain spaces.

In our homes setting aside certain spots as sacred can help us with prayer. Our environment can help us be aware that we are speaking to God. Sacred art can help make a space feel sacred and give us the awareness that we are in the presence of God so that we can consciously be aware that we are speaking and listening to God. The Traveling Icon Kit can be helpful in giving us a sense of the sacred. For a week or two you can take the kit home. Set up the icon to make a space feel sacred. In the kit are several items to help in praying. Within the kit there are prayer items such as rosaries and holy water. There are prayer suggestions such as Novenas or the Five Finger Prayer. Using some of these items with your children can be a good introduction to God's love for them.

I am hoping to get things organized so that we can have each family host the traveling icon for some time.

Study the New Testament via TV or internet


