**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR
THE CHRISTIAN FAMILY**

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that the Christian family is a communion of persons. The word communion means "union with". The family is much more than a mere group of persons with a blood relationship. They have a special relationship to each other. Each member has deep ties, emotional and spiritual as well as physical. Even more than this they are the revelation of God. God is a communion of Persons. The communion of the Trinity is so deep that three Persons are still One God. The intimacy of the family does not go that deep but it is a reflection and revelation of the deep unity of God. The functions of a family also reflect God. The procreation and education of children reflect the Father's work of creation. The prayer and sacrifice of Christ are made visible in the daily prayer and charitable work of the family. The love of a family that reaches out to the world reflects the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

The family has special connection with society. It is the original cell of all social life. Husband and wife begin to form a society by giving themselves in love and the gift of life. Essential aspects of any society such as authority, stability and a life of relationships are learned in families. The family teaches children moral values, how to begin to honor God and make good use of freedom. Through family life the members of a family learn to care for the young, the old, the sick, the handicapped and the poor. In return society has an obligation to support and defend families. Social bodies have the responsibility of helping families that are unable to fulfill their responsibilities. They should help families while avoiding taking over or interfering with families. The Catechism emphasizes the duty of the political community as providing freedom to establish a family, protecting the stability of the marriage bond, providing freedom to profess and live one's faith, protecting the rights to private property, free enterprise, obtaining work and housing and the right to emigrate. Additional duties of the political community include providing the right to medical care, assisting the aged, protecting security and health and providing the freedom to associate with other families.
