

MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

CONFIRMATION

Our Lady of Peace Parish is privileged this weekend to host Bishop John Folda and the children from the neighboring parishes as well as our own parish to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. The parishes included besides Our Lady of Peace are St. Agnes in Hunter, Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Reynolds, St. Jude in Thompson, St. Rose of Lima in Hillsboro, St. William in Argusville, and St. Stephen in Larimore. There will be 52 children confirmed.

Confirmation is a sacrament that is not always well understood. In practical terms we like the sacraments to correspond with our lifestyle. We associate Baptism with birth, First Communion and Reconciliation with the age of reason, Marriage and Holy Orders with becoming adults and Anointing of the Sick with dying. It has been fashionable then to associate Confirmation with graduation. The difficulty is that these associations are not necessarily true. Anointing of the Sick is not about dying, it is for any serious illness. Baptism is not about birth, it is about becoming part of the Body of Christ. It along with Confirmation and First Communion are the ways even adults are initiated into the Church.

Confirmation according to the Catholic Catechism completes baptismal grace so that the recipient is more perfectly bound to the Church. The children today will be enriched with the special strength of the Holy Spirit. The signs of Confirmation are the laying on of hands and the anointing with chrism oil. Chrism oil is a special perfumed oil. Chrism references the title of Christian which means the anointed one just as Christ was the anointed one. In Confirmation the children will receive through the power of the Holy Spirit, seven gifts and twelve fruits. The gifts of the Holy Spirit complete and perfect our virtues. They are Wisdom, Understanding, Knowledge, Counsel, Fortitude, Piety and Fear of the Lord. The fruits of the Holy Spirit are the first fruits of life in the Holy Trinity. They are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, modesty, generosity, gentleness, self-control, chastity.

An objection to the early age of Confirmation is how can children understand and live out these gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. The reality is that living out these gifts is a life-long process. We will never fully personify the fullness of the gifts and fruits in our lives. The point of Christian faith is to realize that we need the generosity of God's love to work towards the perfection God is offering to us. We will not obtain it as the result of our own maturity. Rather by being open to the gift of God's love represented by the
