

## MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

Saul/St. Paul

Saul is introduced in Acts of Apostles as a man feared by the early Christians. For good reason, he had been a powerful persecutor. Now as a new convert he is being avoided. He could easily have given up his new faith as being a strange hallucination. But Barnabas takes him under his wing and introduced him to the apostles. As he shared his experiences they recognized him as having a special call from God.

As a result, Paul began to walk the streets of Jerusalem with the Apostles. He learned the traditions about Jesus about to be handed down. He learned the teachings and sayings of Jesus. Paul is a very bold person. Soon he is debating with the Hellenists, i.e., the Greek speaking Jews. Paul is a pragmatic intellectual. He is pragmatic in the sense that once he is convinced about the truth, he is willing to debate it with those most open to hearing it. He knew the Hellenists were more likely open to new ideas. The Resurrection of Jesus was certainly a new idea. Paul was beginning to look beyond the native Jews, to think about the Gentiles. Greek speaking Jews served as an introduction to his calling.

Paul as an orator and debater easily raised passions. Those unwilling to be convinced by a new idea sometimes will resort to violence to fight. Paul would not have been surprised since that described his previous life as a persecutor of Christians. He soon learned that he needed the support of his new friends. The mood against Paul turned so violent that they took him out of the city and moved him to his hometown of Tarsus.

As an intellectual Paul took the opportunity to reflect on the meaning of redemption and salvation by Jesus. He came to realize that Jesus had changed the meaning of salvation. Holiness did not come by strict observance of the law. He had been one of the strictest followers of the law and yet had missed the significance of Jesus until Jesus spoke to him in the vision on the road to Damascus.

He saw that the death of Jesus was the ultimate gift of love. God in Jesus had sacrificed himself. Jesus, the only Begotten Son had given up every glory due to Him in order to become one with us. Through the cross Jesus so identified Himself with us that He gives Himself permanently to us in the Eucharist. When we eat His Body and drink His Blood, Jesus brings us with Him to the throne of the Father. By the free gift of grace, we are made holy in God's eyes and adopted as His children. We do not have the power to make this happen on our own power. It is only by the gift of the Holy Spirit, the gift of faith in God's love that we become holy.

This theology is given to us in the letters of Paul who answered questions by the early Christians trying to discern what faith in Jesus meant. Paul taught us about the glory of God's love for us. Getting back to the reading all this happened because on Christian, Barnabas, reached out to Paul and brought him into the community of faith guided by the apostles. This is the essence of evangelization welcoming the outsider into the faith. If we bring someone into our community, perhaps we too will encourage a great teacher for the Church.
