MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

PENTECOST (rerun from 2015)

Today we celebrate the feast of Pentecost. After Easter and Christmas this is the most important celebration on the Church's calendar. The world's calendar tends to overshadow its importance. Next Sunday is Memorial Weekend, the beginning of summer weekends. With summer being so short there is a tendency to forget about the importance of Church celebrations. It also gets overshadowed with graduations and weddings when Pentecost occurs in June.

The importance of Pentecost is that it is the celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit. While Jesus made God visible to the world by uniting God to humanity, the Holy Spirit makes it possible for creation to accept this gift and join itself to God. The Holy Spirit, the "breath of God", fills us with God's very own life. Those who grew up with the Baltimore Catechism might remember the term Sanctifying Grace. Sanctifying Grace actually means God giving us His own very life, His own Spirit, to make us holy as He is holy.

The usual way that God chooses to give us His Spirit is through the community of believers who willingly accept the Word of God given to us through Jesus. This community of believers is what we call the Church. The Holy Spirit acts through the sacraments to form us into this community of believers. It is in the Holy Spirit that we become part of the Church. There are several images used to describe this gift that God offers us through the Holy Spirit. St. Paul seems to like the image of the Body of Christ where the various members work together to form one Body united under the Head who is Christ. Some images John's Gospel uses are the vine and the branches or a flock of sheep. The Creed speaks of the Communion of Saints. A popular phrase around Vatican II was the People of God. All of these images share the sense of us being saved not as isolated individuals but as individuals in relationship to others and to God.

The image of Pentecost is that of the disciples gathered in the upper room. Before the gift of the Spirit they come across as frightened individuals trying to understand what Jesus has asked them to do. Suddenly the Holy Spirit forms them into a community of faith, filling the upper room with the wind of eternal life and the energy of tongues of fire. No longer frightened individuals they join with Peter proclaiming to the nations that all are saved by the Blood of the Cross of Jesus. When we accept the gift of salvation by believing that God has loved us that much, we too will be filled with the Spirit. We will be made holy, children of God.

The challenge for most believers is that we do not surrender ourselves fully to God. We are attracted by the habits of earthly life. We do not fully open ourselves to the gift of the Spirit. We have to grow in the life of the Spirit, often experiencing doubts, experiencing the temptations of the world. Our glory and hope is that God continually offers the Spirit to us. The Church born today by the action of the Spirit continually offers us forgiveness and nourishment. Today we celebrate this wonder and mystery expressed in the first experience the disciples have of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.
