

MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

GOD THE FATHER

We believe in one God, so we are monotheists. The uniqueness of Christianity is that it is not merely a monotheistic faith. We are actually Trinitarians; we believe that the divine nature is composed of three divine Persons. Nature has to do with the essence of God's existence, what God is.

Person involves who God is, as we can note from the creeds God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The first paragraph of the Creed proclaims that we believe (in) the Father almighty. This article of faith is accepted by many religions. Many faiths refer to God as Father. He is father for He is the first source of everything. As the next line states He is the maker of heaven and earth. Father has not just the transcendent source of reality, He is also the immanent, i.e., near to our heart, Father who is the fullness of goodness and love. The fatherhood of God has special meaning for us for Jesus revealed God as His Father. When Jesus speaks of the Father, He describes as someone with whom he has a very close relationship. Jesus enjoys going off by Himself and spending long periods of time in conversation with the Father.

Not only is God the Father but He is the Father almighty. Describing God as having the attribute of omnipotence assures us that God is in control of the universe. The Psalms describe God as the Rock who can give an anchor to our life. His power is beyond our understanding. The mystery of evil and freedom challenge our belief in God's power. We tend to think in black and white terms and struggle to understand how evil and freedom can exist alongside of being almighty. For me a way of looking at this is to realize in human terms a person who is confident and strong does not need to advertise how strong he or she is. It is the insecure person who is fearful that usually tries to puff himself up and impress others with his or her abilities. God's power is so deep that He can allow evil and freedom. The wonder of His power is that no matter how great the evil committed, God is able to bring a greater good out of it.


