

MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Today we recognize the great mystery of faith that we celebrate every Sunday. Bread and wine symbolizing our offering of ourselves to God become transformed into the very Person of Jesus. He has invited us to eat His Body and Drink His Blood so that God might become one with us. This sacrifice began on Holy Thursday, climaxed on the Cross on Good Friday and entered into fullness on Easter Sunday.

The word sacrifice means to make holy. A basic human instinct which preceded even the Hebrews has been that we need God or gods. There is something lacking within us. Sometimes this was felt as powerlessness so that sacrifices became a form of bargaining. We will give something of great value representing our desire to be one with God. In return we hope that God will be pleased and will share some of His power with us. To truly give something to God, to make it holy meant destroying something of high value. In farming cultures there is nothing more valuable than the first fruits of the field or the firstborn animal. People would give these things to the temple to be sacrificed to God, hoping in return that God would share His bounty with them.

No matter how much people give to God there is still a separation. We cannot be sure that God is pleased with our sacrifices. Are they really the best we can offer so that He will accept them? During the time of the prophets there grew the realization that more was needed than simple sacrifices. They began to proclaim that even expensive sacrifices are not enough without a transformation of the heart. They started proclaiming that true sacrifice had to be a repentant heart. There had to be awareness and care for the orphan and the widow.

God has chosen to act through Jesus. Not only do we feel emptiness or need for God but God Himself desires us to be one with Him. He began that revelation of His love through Jesus as the revelation of the Trinity. In Jesus we learn that the Father has loved us so much that He sends His Word to redeem us and His Spirit to sanctify, to make us holy. Jesus, the bridge between God and humanity, offers Himself as the true sacrifice that can make us holy and one with God. We enter into that sacrifice by allowing Jesus to become one with us. When we eat His Body and drink His Blood, our very bodies and souls are being transformed into His Body. God comes as close to us as is possible in this life.

Of course the challenge is that most of us are mere infants in faith. We sort of believe and accept Jesus into ourselves. Few of us are able to truly let go of our skepticism and doubt to fully allow the Spirit of God to take over our spirit. In this life we continue to face a tug of war between the attractions of this world and the realization that God has given Himself to us in the most intimate way possible as the food we eat, the life that sustains us. So we must continue to participate in this mystery hoping to gain ever greater insight into the wonder that God is changing us. He is adopting us into His family making us God with Him.

Though these are wonders way beyond our comprehension in this life, we still celebrate and rejoice that we have a God who cares so much for us. Today we focus especially on the closeness that Jesus has to us, that we actually take Him into our own bodies and make Him one with us.

There will be a potluck farewell supper for Monsignor Pilon at 6 pm on Wednesday, June 13 in the social hall. Please bring a dish to share and lots of good wishes for Monsignor! Dessert, coffee, lemonade and water will be provided.
