**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR  
DIVORCE**

During this year of Marriage and Family we have been focusing on strengthening and recognizing married couples. As we get part way through this year we also must recognize those who have suffered from the pain of divorce. Pope John Paul II spoke of the importance of recognizing that many have experienced this pain. In his official document on Family Life, **Familiaris Consortio**, he states the following:

I earnestly call upon pastors and the whole community of the faithful to help the divorced, and with solicitous care to make sure they do not consider themselves as separated from the Church, for as baptized person they can, and indeed must share in her life.

The U.S. Bishops in their document **Marriage: Love and Life in the Divine Plan**, have stated:  
We understand the pain of those for whom divorce seemed the only recourse...We also offer encouragement to those who have divorced and remarried civilly. We encourage divorced persons who wish to marry in the Catholic Church to seek counsel about the options that exist to remedy their situation, including the suitability of a declaration of nullity.

As the authors, Lorrie and Don Gramer state in their **Guide to a Marriage Building Parish**, divorce is unique among life experiences. There is no precedent that can prepare an individual for it. Divorce is a process, not an event. Legal divorce can be pinpointed to a moment in time, to the signing of a court decision, but not so the experience for divorce. The experience of divorce is the result of a series of incidents that eventually erode a relationship between a husband and a wife. The ending of any marriage that has endured long enough for the two partners to invest portions of their lives, money, emotions and dreams is often a devastating experience.

The first thing an individual must do is to take care of the self. Their children, their job, their extended family will all suffer more if they are not healthy and hopeful for the future. Adults and children should not go through separation or divorce alone. The Church seeks to offer help on the journey toward healing and recovery. Support Groups and Healing retreats such as Beginning Experience as well as the care of the Church can offer benefit to divorcing Catholics. The Church can also offer assistance by helping a divorced person determine their status through the Annulment process.

As Catholics, we believe that marriage is permanent and indissoluble. The beauty and wisdom of this teaching may bring additional pain to those who are separated or divorced. There are many representatives of the Church who are available and can appreciate and validate the significance of this situation.

In 1978 two young mothers, the Holy Spirit called Annette Mears and Dorothy Gustafson to establish a Catholic youth camp in North Dakota. For the past 37 years, this duo has run Trinity Youth Camp, providing children in grades 4-8 an opportunity to experience Christ through Nature, Mass, Reconciliation, music, crafts, recreation, and friendship. 42 youth attended the camp in 1978; today more than 500 attend annually regardless of their financial situation. Campers often come back as counselors, and each year everyone experiences a joy-filled week of Catholic friendships, memories, and values. For Annette and Dorothy, their years of fulfilling God's call is a labor of love that has been termed "a model example of lay ministry."

If Annette and Dorothy receive this award, Trinity Youth Camp and the Diocese of Fargo each will receive a \$25,000 grant for a total of \$50,000 to fund their ministry.
