Message from Monsignor - Seeds

Summer is a time for growth. We see plants and life developing in abundance. Life starts so small. Small seeds somehow become larger plants and eventually produce a yield. Parable Jesus compares that to the Kingdom of God. Jesus seems to be suggesting that God has planted His kingdom within us. If we are honest with ourselves we recognize that the kingdom is like a seed. No matter how awestruck we may be with God, we know that we quickly forget about Him. We might even feel guilty over how few times during the day we will realize that He is present among us. Somehow the readings seem to be meant to give us a sense of reassurance. Jesus observes that ordinary seed are put in the ground. Somehow without our awareness that seed will put forth a blade, an ear and produce fruit into that ear. Similarly with God, even when we fail to consciously be aware of Him, He is working in our life. Often we can only see that process by looking back.

As an example I look at my service on the Marriage Tribunal for the Diocese where I worked full time for 20 years and still assist as Defender of the Bond. I grew up in an intact family and would not have expected to participate especially in a ministry to the divorced. But while I was in Seminary for a class we were asked to pick a pastoral project to research in about 1975. I happened to choose at random Ministry to the Divorced. I remember being struck by how little pastoral attention was given to people going through divorce at that time. After ordination my first two years were with pastors who had a reputation for being difficult to work with. Now I could probably just ignore them but then I was eager to please and found these situations very painful. Then a parishioner suggested a program she had heard about for divorced and widowed people, Beginning Experience. Having gone through my own difficult experiences it was easy to relate to the pain of loss and loneliness. By working with B.E. I was asked to assist as an advocate and sometimes as a judge for the Tribunal. Next thing I know Bishop Driscoll tells me to go study Canon Law to take over the Tribunal. After two years of study I came back to be the Judicial Vicar for the diocese for twenty years.
