**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR**

**JOHN THE BAPTIST**



This past Wednesday we celebrate the Nativity of John the Baptist. This is very unusual for the celebration of Feast Days of the Saints. The only other persons whose births are commemorated are Jesus and Mary. John the Baptist is important for he is the prophet who bridges the Old Covenant with Israel preparing for the coming of the Messiah, Jesus. He is the immediate prophet who prepares the way for Jesus. He is the one who recognizes Jesus at His baptism as being the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.

When Jesus comes on the scene, John is a very powerful and popular preacher. Crowds traveled through the desert to get to the Jordan River. Upon hearing John they would go into the river to be baptized by John. Baptism was not simply getting some water sprinkled on the head. It meant being dunked totally into the water.

As with Jesus we do not know the precise birth date of John. What we do know is that Elizabeth was in her sixth month of pregnancy when the Annunciation that she was to be the mother of the Savior was given to Mary. In the Gospel of John (3:30), the Baptist says of Jesus, "He must increase, but I must decrease." The

Church is able to recognize this desire of John by placing the feasts right after the summer and winter solstices. We remember the birth of John, just as the days begin to get shorter. We glory in the birth of Jesus as the days begin to get longer.

This desire of John is also a reminder to anyone who does public ministry of their ultimate purpose. In ministry we try to attract people to Jesus who is acting within us. But we always have to remember that each of us is only an instrument of God. We are not the goal of ministry but rather the bridge to Jesus. This is true not just of priestly ministry but of every kind of ministry. Whether one reads the scriptures, distributes the Body or Blood of Christ, leads the congregation in musical worship or greets people as they come to Mass, he or she is a sign of the presence of Christ. We try to do our ministry well to attract people to Jesus, but we always must remember that Christ is to be the center and goal not ourselves.
