**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR
FAMILIAL LOVE**

The theme for July in the Year of the Family being celebrated by the Diocese of Fargo is Familial Love. St. John Paul II wrote a document called "Familiaris Consortio (On the Christian Family)". Below from paragraph 18 is a quote that he wrote about familial love.



The family, which is founded and given life by love, is a community of persons: of husband and wife, of parents and children, of relatives. Its first task is to live with fidelity the reality of communion in a constant effort to develop an authentic community of persons.

The inner principle of that task, its permanent power and its final goal is love: without love the family is not a community of persons and, in the same way, without love the family cannot live, grow and perfect itself as a community of persons. ..

The love between husband and wife and, in a derivatory and broader way, the love between members of the same family-between parents and children, brothers and sisters and relatives and members of the household-is given life and sustenance by an unceasing inner dynamism leading the family to ever deeper and more intense communion, which is the foundation and soul of the

community of marriage and the family.

The Pope is emphasizing the importance of the family is teaching through experience the reality of love. The purpose of family is to teach every member the experience of love. No one can learn to love in isolation; we learn to love through the common relationships that are present in family. In sort of a virtuous circle love builds and strengthens family relationships into a common unity, called communion.

I left out of the above quote, at the end of the second paragraph, a reference to his encyclical "Redemptor humanis" (p. 45) because it seemed rather dense to read. The essence of the reference that I left out emphasizes the necessity of love for a human being. Without love a person lacks all meaning and purpose. So a person cannot live without love.

The love of family is essential for every person's mental and spiritual health. Without purpose or meaning a person has no direction or reason for existing. He or she will feel nothing. Pope John Paul insists that family love is not just important, it is vital for every person's emotional and spiritual existence. Family is not just a nice group of people with whom we have some connection. It is within family that we discover our identity and role in life.

The motto of the VA Medical Foster Home program is ‘Where Heroes Meet Angels.’ The program provides long term care for disabled Veterans who prefer a family setting over a nursing home. The program partners with people with caregiving experience, who live within a 50 mile radius of Fargo and who have extra room in their homes and their hearts. Medical Foster Home Caregivers would take in up to three Veterans and provide their ongoing care and supervision. The home must meet the VA’s fire and safety requirements and will be inspected by a VA team before approval. The VA Home Based Primary Care team comes into the home to provide medical case management to the Veteran. The Veteran pays the caregiver a monthly rate based on the care level needed.
