**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR**

**Assumption of Mary**

On Saturday August 15 we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary. This would ordinarily be a Holy Day of obligation. It is one of the Holy Days that is relaxed from being a Day of Obligation when it occurs on a Saturday or Monday. The feast itself is a celebration of a statement that was declared a dogma of the Catholic Church by Pope Pius XII in 1950. Though it was only declared in 1950 it has a long history. The Eastern Churches both the Orthodox and the Eastern Churches in union with Rome celebrate the Assumption under the title the Dormition of Mary. This is one of the places to visit if you are ever visiting the Holy sites in Israel. The teaching is



relatively simple: "the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death." The importance of this teaching is not just about Mary but about the hope promised for the Church. Mary is a symbol of the Church and is the primary member of the Church. What has happened to Mary will happen to all who are faithful to the Church. This teaching emphasizes that Mary is assumed *body and soul* into heavenly glory. Jesus did not rise from dead just for Himself but to promise us eternal life by our own resurrection. The most important aspect of this is that resurrection does not mean the soul is freed from the body. Resurrection means that we have the promise in a renewed body and soul. When Jesus at the completion of time returns to judge heaven and earth, He will restore heaven and earth to

new glory in union with God. At that moment we will also be restored to a new body and soul. We have no idea what these will look like, other than the stories of Jesus resurrection appearances. Somehow we will have communion with the Holy Trinity and with one another. An important implication of this is that we are not simply souls trapped in a miserable body. We are embodied spirits. There is both a physical and a spiritual aspect to us. Our bodies are just as sacred and essential to our being as our spirits or souls. The earth itself though wounded by human sin will one day be restored to its intended glory. Mary serves as the image or icon of what has been promised by Christ. In the assumption we celebrate the amazing hope offered to us by Christ that one day we will rise again and be filled with joy at our union with God in a new earth and a new heaven.
