MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

WHAT IS A HOMILY 2

This is a continuation from a newsletter from Assumption Abbey in Richardton ND in which Abbot Brian Wangler wrote an article with this title. I thought it was a good reflection on what a homily is about not just for me as a preacher but also for you as a People meeting God in the Eucharist. He notes that many of his thoughts are inspired by Pope Francis in his Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel)*. I only had room for the two of the three requirements needed for a homily to promote a dialogue between God and the people.

The first requirement had been that both homilist and congregation be serious about God. The second requirement was that the homilist and the congregation be aware that the homily is a dialogue between God and his people, facilitated by the

homilist. Father Wangler continues with the third requirement:

“If a homily is a dialogue between God and his people facilitated by the homilist, the homilist is the one who will have to work the hardest at making himself available to God. The Holy Spirit, the third person of the Blessed Trinity, has already spoken in and through the history of Israel and through the history of the Church, especially as expressed in the Bible. The Bible is the Church's book; it is the divinely inspired book that presents God's teaching to Israel and the teaching of the apostles who are the very foundations stones of the Church. Therefore the preacher must soak himself in Scripture so that he will know almost by instinct, how the Holy Spirit works and thus be more able to point toward the Spirit's work in our lives.”

“How does the homilist do that? By preparation and more preparation. Pope Francis says of the Sunday homily that ‘a prolonged time of study, prayer, reflection and pastoral creativity should be devoted to it.’ He adds: ‘I presume to ask [of preachers] that each week a sufficient portion of personal and

community time be dedicated to the this task, even if this means less time has to be given to other important activities.’ This indicates how important Pope Francis believes the homily is. Having reminded myself of that and what a homily is, I hope I will use the ideas for preparation of homily Pope Francis offers in *Evangelii Gaudium* for the good of the Church and myself.”
