Universal: That volunteers may give themselves generously to the service of the needy...

MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR SUBMISSION OF WIFE?

St. Paul seems to get a bad rap for one short phrase that we read in today's New Testament reading. Somehow the phrase "wives should be subordinate (submissive) to their husbands as the Church is to the Lord" grabs all the attention and we miss the context of these words and miss their meaning. The first thing we should notice is the preceding sentence that begins today's reading. He tells his readers "Brothers and sisters, be subordinate to each other out of reverence for Christ. Not just wives but all people are to have an attitude of subordination towards each other.

St. Paul then wants to take marriage as an experience that teaches the relationship between god and His people. St. Paul takes a good marriage to be an icon or image of the relationship between Christ and His Church. It works the other way too. If we focus on the relationship Jesus has with His Church we will discover God's plan for marriage.

St. Paul points out there are two parties involved in a commitment like marriage. In any marriage there will be times when one party such as the wife will be in a subordinate role to the other. But this subordination is not so that the husband gains power and glory. Rather it gives the opportunity for the husband to love his wife. Love means like Christ being willing to sacrifice all of his own desires in order to make his wife holy and beautiful without blemish or spot in his eyes. A husband is to care for his wife as he cares for his own body, nourishing and cherishing it.

The final paragraph is interesting. It speaks of the husband leaving his father and mother to be joined to his wife and become one flesh. Referencing only the husband leaving father and mother, suggest that St. Paul wants people to read the passage almost as if it were a palindrome. To fully understand St. Paul's intent the words husband and wife need to be switched with each other. The husband needs to be subordinate to his wife so that she can take on the role of making him holy without blemish or spot in her sight. Then she can leave father and mother to be joined to her husband and become one flesh.

St. Paul's view of marriage is not one-sided where one side gets an advantage over the other. It is really about mutual self-giving treating each other as well as a person treats his or her own body nourishing it and cherishing it.
