**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR
YEAR OF MARRIAGE AND FAMILY**

An interesting human dynamic is our readiness to dismiss important and interesting experiences because we associate them with common experiences. Two of the most common and important experiences in our life are family and God. What can be more important than family and God? Yet how much time and energy do we put into our relationships with our families or our God. These are the things that can sustain us and give us life beyond this one. Somehow we fall into the trap of putting our focus and our energies on lesser realities. Work and recreation take over our lives and pull us away from family and God. The role of Church is to try to remind us what is truly important in life.

As we approach the completion of the *Year of Marriage and Family* we have the opportunity to renew our focus on family and God on Saturday October 24 at a conference called *Living Reflections of God's Love*. The Diocese has been promoting this widely. In our busy lives it can be easy to overlook because it does not involve work or expensive recreation. This will truly be a family conference as there will be three specific programs one for adults, one for youth and one for children. There are some high-powered speakers. I know the Cavins have written some very good bible study programs. Father Shea is from the University of Mary and has a number of initiatives going on at the University. Other speakers I am not directly familiar with but their bio's sound very dynamic. These are national personalities that we are lucky to be able to host in Fargo. Often people will complain that the Church is not exciting, yet when exciting conferences are provided we often do not even think about participating. If you make the effort to attend this conference, I am sure you will find it an exciting experience. The diocesan staff is putting a lot of effort to make this a worthwhile experience.
