**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR
MESSIAH**

In this important passage of the New Testament Jesus asks the Apostles: who do people say that I am? They mention famous, influential people like John the Baptist, Elijah or one of the prophets. Then He asks so who do you say that I am? This seems to almost be a test for Jesus to evaluate how well He is communicating the message from God. The prophets like John the Baptist and Elijah were always pointing to the future. God will be sending you a Messiah. In the Old Testament was understood as the anointed king who would restore the monarchy in the line of David. They were looking for a king who would restore Israel. They hoped that this king would restore the tribes



ample to be a worthy place for God's presence.

Jesus has been going around proclaiming that God is using Him to bring about the Kingdom of God. This must have seemed to be quite a stretch to believe. Does he really expect them to believe that this wood-worker from Galilee was going to establish a throne in Jerusalem? He may be a charismatic speaker and healer but how can they believe that He is the Anointed One (literal meaning of Messiah). So Jesus takes the risk to ask His disciples, who do you say that I am? To his credit Peter proclaims you are the Christ. (Note Christ is the Greek word for Anointed One, while Messiah is the Hebrew word). Jesus immediately begins to explain that though He is the Messiah or Christ, He is not the typical king. He must suffer greatly, be rejected by all who are in the important

leadership of Israel. He must be killed and will rise on the third day. Peter objects: "No Master that cannot happen. Jesus turns on him saying "Get behind me Satan...", you are not thinking as God does.

This concept of the Messiah is the biggest challenge for Christians. Like Peter we tend to think as humans not as God. When we are struggling with life events, whether personal, communities or nations, we look for God to send us a Messiah. We want someone who will have the power to set things right and put us back into powerful positions we believe we deserve. The challenge Jesus raises for us is that Jesus' idea is that we must embrace our suffering. In accepting our weakness, our failures, we help Jesus bring about the true Kingdom of God. Confident in the hope of Resurrection we can empathize with the powerless and stand up and confront those who may be causing abuse and suffering. As St. Paul also says it is in weakness that we are truly strong.
