MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR - FAITH IN THE NEWS

This past week has been good week for celebrating the value of Faith in a public way. Pope Francis through not only his words but his actions has shown the beauty and the value of faith in a very public way. Many people have been moved by the simplicity and integrity of Pope Francis. There was another incident of living out faith expressed on a more local level. I was impressed to read of several Islamic students in the West Fargo school district who chose to celebrate Eid, the highest feast of their faith. They had the courage to insist that their faith was more important than the team sports that they were involved in. They must have been under severe pressure not just from their coaches but by their teammates. By choosing to make faith the higher priority in their lives, the West Fargo football team was at risk of having to forfeit a game. Anyone who has been associated with high school sports knows that this would not go over well. Especially, since Islam is a minority religion in our area, I can imagine the severe criticism the Islamic students would have faced being responsible for the possible forfeiture of a game. These students and their parents had to have a lot of courage to withstand the pressure.

Fortunately, for the West Fargo team the game at risk was scheduled to be played with the coalition of Christian schools: Shanley, Oak Grove and Park Christian. These schools being faith-based schools recognized the importance of the witness being shown by the Islamic students. They agreed to reschedule the game, rather than force West Fargo to forfeit it. The Islamic students and the Christian schools provide a wonderful example of a proper ordering of values. They recognize that celebrating an eternal relationship with God has much greater value and importance than a passing game. The witness that these people played, like the example provided by Pope Francis.

This witness and example should raise for us the question, what would be our priorities in life. We claim to be Catholic Christian. Jesus invites us to celebrate His love for us by sharing His Body and Blood with us each week. Would we make the eternal friendship God is offering to us the top priority in our lives? Or do momentary experiences seem more exciting and therefore more valuable? Would our parents be able to take the same kind of pride in the choices of their children that the parents of the Islamic students must have? Children learn first by example of their parents. I wonder what it says to children when their parents regularly find excuses to skip Mass. Will children really develop a friendship with God if they are dropped off at religion classes but seldom attend Mass with their parents?

Sometimes people ask will God really send me to Hell if I skip Mass. This question implies that God is a judge who punishes behavior. God does not judge us, we judge ourselves. When we face judgment God will not force Himself on us. If we have told Him that passing earthly things are more important than the joy He can offer, He will allow us to spend eternity running on that futile treadmill. On the other hand if we have expressed the desire to know His love, we have His promise that He will offer us the choicest delights beyond our imagination.
