**Holy Father's Prayer Intentions for November**

**Universal:** That we may be open to personal encounter and dialogue with all, even those whose convictions differ from our own.  
**Evangelization:** That pastors of the church, with profound love for their flocks, may accompany them and enliven their hope.

**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR LAUDATO SI (paragraphs 3- 9)**

In the next few paragraphs Pope Francis places this encyclical in the context of the teaching of several preceding Popes. He notes that Pope Saint John XXIII wrote about the nuclear crisis that was putting the world at risk at that time. He challenged the world with a proposal for peace in *Pacem in Terris*. Eight years later Paul VI spoke about the “ecological concern in his time as a tragic consequence of human activity.” Paul VI called for a radical change in human conduct. Paul VI taught that scientific and technical advances and economic growth if not accompanied by social and moral progress, will actually cause harm to humanity.

Pope Saint John Paul II in his first Encyclical warned that humans seem to look no further than how the environment can serve for immediate use and consumption. He taught that true human development includes not just full respect for the human person but also the world around us. We must consider the nature of other creatures and how they are intimately connected with each other in an orderly system.

Pope Benedict XVI taught that “the book of nature is one and indivisible”. We do not have the right to look for what benefits humanity at this moment without considering its effect on the environment, life, sexuality, social relationships and so forth. Pope Benedict emphasized that creation is harmed when we think we have the last word; that everything is our property and we can do with it as we will. Misuse of creation happens because we choose not to recognize any higher power than ourselves.

Francis observes that many other scientists, philosophers, theologians and civic groups have made similar observations. He quotes extensively from the Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew. (Bartholomew is Patriarch of Constantinople., which is in Istanbul. He is considered to be the “first among equals” of the patriarchs or leaders of the Orthodox churches.) Bartholomew has spoken of the need for each of us to repent of the ways we have damaged the planet. Each of us in smaller or larger ways have participated in disfiguring and destroying creations. Bartholomew has emphasized that we must look at the ethical and spiritual roots of environmental problems. Looking for technological fixes would be dealing only with symptoms not with the causes of environmental sins.

In these several paragraphs Pope Francis has shown that he is not alone in his concern for our treatment of the environment. He is also showing that this is not just simply a question of finding simple fixes. As a spiritual father he is concerned that all of us recognize our mutual responsibility for not just’s not just for the human race but for all of God’s creation. Because everything has been created by God is has it is owed due reverence by all of us. If we are truly going to solve our environmental problems, we are going to have to repent and learn to respect God’s creation.

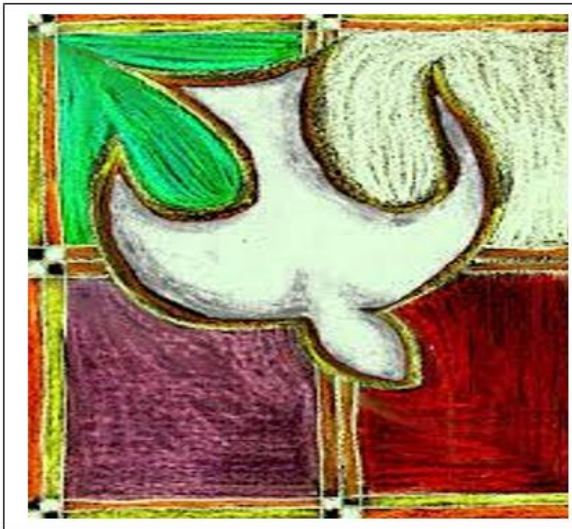
