Message from Monsignor Thanksgiving

Being that I have been on retreat all week, I have not had time to compose a Message for this week. Instead I have decided to reprint a message from a previous year about the upcoming Thanksgiving holiday.

As we approach the holiday of Thanksgiving, we enter into something unusual. It is probably the least commercialized holiday of all, even though Christmas shopping seems to be moving into the holiday more and more. Giving thanks seems to be a universal instinct in human beings. Nearly every culture has some kind of harvest festival. There is a need to recognize that the wonder of all the gifts we have received come from outside ourselves. Even with all the work of raising food, farmers realize that they are at the mercy of powers beyond the visible.

On another level thanksgiving fits very well with Catholic worship. We celebrate thanksgiving not just once a year but every week or even form many every day. The central celebration of our faith is the Eucharist. The Eucharist derives from a Greek word which means to give thanks. We celebrate with the gifts that God has given us through the work of our hands and the fruits of the earth, the bread and wine. In thanksgiving we offer these simple gifts to the Creator and Father of the universe. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, God transforms these gifts into the Body and Blood of His Son which He then gives to us in communion. United with the Body and Blood of Jesus the Spirit brings us into a mystical union with God and all the saints. As a mystical union it is not visible to human eyes, but to the eyes of faith we are in the presence of our God. He welcomes us, embraces us, consoles our sorrows, rejoices with us in our gifts. The Spirit constantly whispers God's love to us, inviting us to respond "I love you".

Because this is too powerful for us to experience in its fullness God shares this experience in rituals of words and sacred elements. The danger of rituals is that they can become routine so we do not recognize all that God is doing for us. The importance of special days like Thanksgiving is that they can remind us of the wonders of our life and renew a spirit of gratitude and wonder for a God who loves us so much.


Financial Peace University Class:

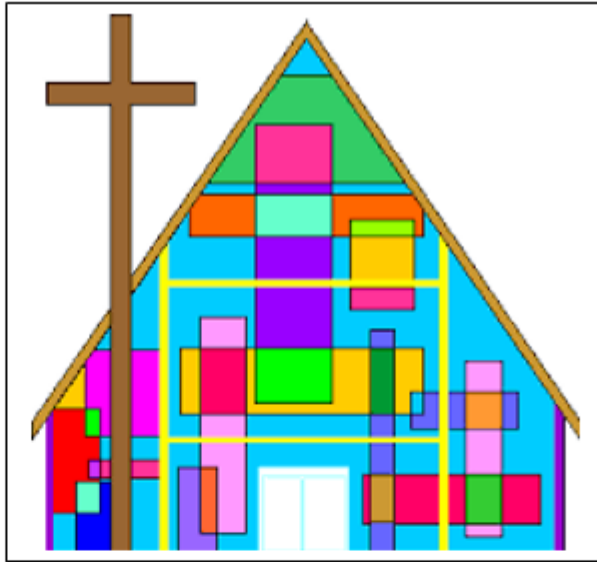
