Holy Father's Prayer Intentions for November

Universal: That we may be open to personal encounter and dialogue with all, even those whose convictions differ from our own.

Evangelization: That pastors of the church, with profound love for their flocks, may accompany them and enliven their hope.

MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

LAUDATO, SI' (par. 2)

"2. This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her. We have come to see ourselves as her lords and masters, entitled to plunder her at will. The violence present in our hearts, wounded by sin, is also reflected in the symptoms of sickness evident in the soil, in the water, in the air and in all forms of life. This is why the earth herself, burdened and laid waste, is among the most abandoned and maltreated of our poor; she "groans in travail" (*Rom 8:22*). We have forgotten that we ourselves are dust of the earth (*cf. Gen 2:7*); our very bodies are made up of her elements, we breathe her air and we receive life and refreshment from her waters."

Pope Francis begins the encyclical much like we do the Mass. He began with a greeting praising God for the gift of the earth who is both our sister and our mother. In the second paragraph he acknowledges the sins and of each of us as well regarding our treatment of our sister the earth. He notes that our sister, the earth, is crying out to us because of the harm we have done to her. Later in the encyclical Francis will point out more specifically the ways the earth is crying out to us. At this point we are to begin the first step of repentance by recognizing our sin. Our sin is that we have failed to recognize that we are part of the earth. Our bodies are formed from the same elements of the earth. Instead we have decided to see ourselves as masters of the earth. We have abused the call to dominion over the earth by seeing ourselves as master rather than servant to God's creation. He reminds us that we all struggle with the desire to be violent in our heart, to lord it over others rather than always have a reverent respect. This violence is being reflected in the sickness that is evident in soil, air, water and all forms of life.

We see here how rabid climate change deniers may be frustrated with Pope Francis. He is being very forthright as all the prophets have been. He sees us committing sins against the earth, points out the harm we are doing to the earth and to ourselves and invites us to begin to reflect on how we can repent. He will be inviting us to consider how we might change directions in our life so that we truly respect the earth rather than blithely continue to abuse the earth.

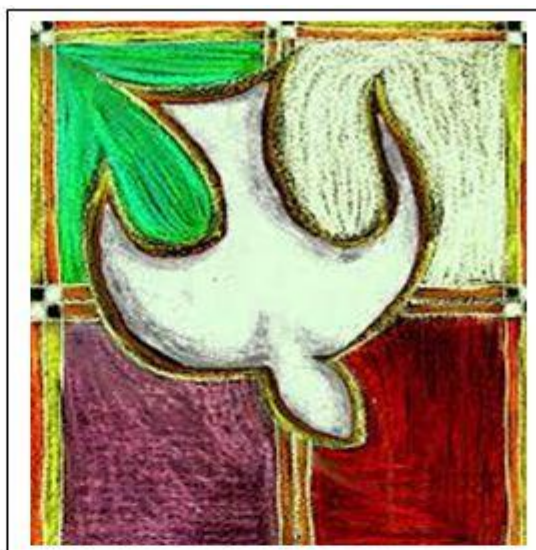
