MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR
WELCOME HOLY FATHER

As I write this the Holy Father is beginning his first visit to the United States. It is an honor when we realize that he is responsible for one billion Catholics all around the world. He will probably have some challenging messages for us in the United States. He has lived out the teaching of the Church that it, like Jesus, is to have a preferential option for the poor. Not only does he come from



a poor country, he has dedicated himself to ministry to the poor and marginalized. You probably have heard the same stories that even as Cardinal, he did not drive around in some limousine. Rather he took the bus and walked around his diocese of Buenos Aires. So it will be very natural that he will remind us, who live in a very wealthy country, that we have a special responsibility to the poor.

I am in the midst of reading his latest encyclical, *Laudato Si*. One aspect of this encyclical is reminding us that we humans still struggle with sin and pride. One of the great sins that we as a human community are guilty of is failing to respect God's creation. The earth was created to be a garden to serve the needs of all, not simply a resource to be exploited. In the process of causing climate change, we compound the sin by having the consequences harm the poor rather than those responsible for the exploitation of the earth.

As a good Pastor, Francis is calling us to repentance. He is inviting to look beyond our own wants and desires to discern God's will in our daily actions. If we can put our energy into learning and observing the ways of God, we have hope for a resurrection of the earth. Jesus kept his focus on the true life of God's love. As a result He did the impossible, He conquered death itself in the Resurrection. If every Christian would imitate Jesus by putting God first in their lives, even the harm done by our exploitation of the earth and the resulting climate change can be overcome.
