MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

DEDICATION OF THE ST. JOHN LATERAN BASILICA

Today's Feast might seem unusual. Instead of being the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary time, it is the feast of the dedication of a church. Complicating matters further is the confusion over why this church. When we think of the Pope's cathedral, most people assume we are referring to the Church of St. Peter in the Vatican. Despite being a convenient Church for the Pope to use, being next to the papal apartments and offices, it is not his official church. Its importance is that it is built over the traditional gravesite of St. Peter.

Because Rome was the center for communication and governance in the time of the early Church, it was natural for Peter and Paul to come to Rome to spread the good news of Christianity to the Roman Empire. Since both Paul and Peter were martyred in Rome, this gave the community of Rome special importance. Ignatius of Antioch as he was being led in chains to Rome described the Church of Rome as presiding in charity over the whole Catholic communion.

The site of the Lateran Basilica was given to the Pope to use as his cathedral by the emperor Constantine. He made Christianity legal ending the official persecutions of Christians. The actual church has been rebuilt a few times but this has remained the official Cathedral site. For the first millennium of the Church this was both the cathedral and the official residence of the Pope.

The Lateran part of the name comes from the emperor's wife. Her family, the Laterani family, had a palace on this site. When Constantine razed the palace to build the Basilica on the Lateran hill, Lateran became part of its official title. The St. John can refer to the Baptist or the Evangelist. Both serve as patrons of proclaiming Christ, the good news of God.

The word cathedral comes from cathedra meaning chair. Every cathedral has an official chair for the bishop symbolizing that his pastoral authority and responsibility is derived from his presiding over the Eucharist. The pope, as the Bishop of Rome, has the primacy of authority and responsibility for the whole Church. It is by virtue of being in communion with the Bishop of Rome that all bishops of the world share their unity and pastoral care for the whole Church. The Bishop of Rome has the responsibility of being a spokesman for the entire Church. He also has the pastoral authority to guide and lead the universal Church in its responsibility to give praise and glory to God. *(continued on last page)*

St. John Lateran symbolizes the source of the Pope's authority and responsibility. He is Pope because he is Bishop of Rome. His responsibility to guide and care for the people of Rome gives him the addition responsibility of caring for the universal Church. The feast of the Dedication of St. John Lateran symbolizes some aspect of the Church. The long history of the Lateran site emphasizes the continuity of the Faith. Its founding on that site emphasizes the importance of evangelization as that was the purpose of Peter and Paul coming to Rome. As the seat of the Pope's pastoral authority, the Basilica stands as a symbol of the unity of the Church despite its wide diversity from being spread throughout the world. The role of the Church of Rome is being a sign of continuity and evangelization.


