MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

ROSARY

On Tuesday of last week we celebrated the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. The rosary is a long lasting devotion in the Catholic Church. According to the Catholic Catechism the rosary developed as a substitute for the Liturgy of the Hours. In the Church religious such as monks, nuns and clergy have as their primary duty of prayer to pray the Psalms several times a day. For monks and nun this would usually be 7 times a day, for clergy in parishes 4 times a day. There are a total of 150 Psalms. In medieval times many lay people aspired to live a life of prayer while being responsible for work and family. Many also did not know how to read. The rosary started out as a substitute for the Psalms. Each set of five decades of the Hail Mary focuses on a set of mysteries of our faith such as the sorrowful, joyful and glorious. Each day of the week would focus on a one set of mysteries. In this way a rhythm of prayer similar to the Liturgy of the Hours would develop.

The rosary itself provides a natural rhythm with the repetition of the Hail Mary to promote meditative prayer. The repetition of the prayers is meant to free our minds from daily tasks in order to reflect on the meaning of a mystery of faith for our life. The challenge is to avoid falling into daydreams and keep our mind on the mystery we are trying to contemplate. The power of repetitive chants like the Hail Mary is that it frees the mind to explore something other than the mundane in front of us. We must choose the world we wish to explore: the daydream in which I see myself as the hero or the wonder of salvation in which we see God acting to save us.

The mysteries of the rosary are these: **Joyful Mysteries** said on Monday & Saturday: 1) The Annunciation of the Lord to Mary, 2) The Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth, 3) The Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ 4) The Presentation of our Lord 5) Finding Jesus in the Temple at age 12. The **Sorrowful Mysteries** are said Tuesday & Friday: 1) The Agony of Jesus in the Garden, 2) The Scourging at the Pillar, 3) Jesus is Crowned with Thorns, 4) Jesus Carried the Cross 5) The Crucifixion of our Lord. The **Glorious Mysteries** are said Wednesday & Sunday: 1) The Resurrection of Jesus Christ, 2) The Ascension of Jesus to Heaven, 3) The Descent of the Holy Ghost, 4) The Assumption of Mary into Heaven 5) Mary is Crowned as Queen of Heaven and Earth. The **Luminous Mysteries** are said Thursday: 1) The Baptism in the Jordan, 2) The Wedding at Cana, 3) The Proclamation of the Kingdom, 4) The Transfiguration 5) The Institution of the Eucharist.

Dear Member of Our Lady of Peace,

Our Lady of Peace is facing some fiscal challenges. The Finance Council believes it is important to make every parishioner aware of the difficulties. Below is a list of the challenges we have faced this year:

The weekly contribution level is down about \$4,500 from last year.

- Utility bills are up about \$1,500
- Repairs on the Geothermal heating system \$1,560
- Deductible part of replacing fascia \$1,000
- Legal bills for the EEOC investigation \$1,050

In addition to these actual costs there are some significant expenses that we are facing.:

- \$5,300 Replacing the failed compressors on the heating/AC Geothermal unit for the church
- \$1000 repairing water damage by bathrooms
- \$2000 replacing shingles on the valleys on the roof of the church/social hall. Presently they are tarred, tar on one valley gave way causing water damage
- \$2000 (est.) to replace the stone deck in front of the parish house, Stone appears to be leaning against foundation of the house
- \$6000 replace the sanitizer/dishwasher with equivalent commercial model

We also need to be realistic about the longer term. There are five units that are part of the Geothermal system. As I understand, they have a life expectancy of about 20 years. There are also going to be other unexpected repairs as the building ages. It is now over 12 years old.

The question facing us is how we solve the problem. Potential solutions include


- Increasing contributions both Sunday and special contributions for the building
- Recruiting more households to join and contribute to the parish
- Hold more fundraisers and rent church out to groups
- Seek to become a mission parish under a larger parish, sharing the cost

There may be other solutions which can be proposed to the Finance Council and the Parish Council. We hope that this give you an accurate picture of the financial position of the parish. The final decision rests in your hands to decide how important having the church as a symbol of your faith present in this community.
