**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR**

**MONTH OF DEAD**

Next Sunday will be All Souls Day when we focus on prayers for the dead. Normally November 1, the feast of All Saints, is a Holy Day of Obligation. Because it occurs on a Saturday it is considered a Solemnity but not a day of obligation. These two feasts illustrate the statement of the Creed that we recite every Sunday. In the Creed we proclaim "I believe in...the Communion of the Saints." The Communion of the Saints testifies to our belief that physical death does not mean the end of our existence. By our participation in the Resurrection of Jesus in Baptism we are given the promise and hope of eternal life.

When we die physically we leave the realm of time and earthly existence. The eternal life that we first receive in Baptism comes into full flower for us at the time of death. Unless we have rejected God fully in this life refusing His gift of life we will stand before God in a higher level of sainthood from life on earth. The ideal we strive for is full sainthood in heaven in complete union with God. This is the state where we will have surrendered our lives completely to God's love and forgiveness. Though enjoying fully the bliss of being in the presence of and united with the Holy Trinity, they still maintain a connection with us. They are able to love us with not just a human love but with divine love as well. Just as we might as a holy person in this life to pray for us, we can confidently ask these saints to pray for us as well.

With confidence and hope for eternal life being our focus death should lose its fear for us. Our hope is to join St. Paul in 1 Cor. 15:55 is saying "O death where is your victory, where is your sting." Being able to say this at the moment of death will require great faith. During the Eucharist we allow God to nurture our faith so that we might be ready to let go of this life and join God in the fullness of eternity. The Eucharist is a foretaste of heaven. Jesus gives Himself to us in the form of His Body and Blood. In the weakness of our faith we do not always grasp the wonder of this mystery. But through communion we are made one not just with Jesus but with every person who has gone before us in faith. By focusing on death during this month which symbolically prepares us for the death that winter represents, the Church invites us to move to a new level in celebrating the Eucharist. As we recognize our own mortality we may be moved to look beyond the ritual to the inner meaning of the Mass.

Minto Sacred Heart Church’s Fall Dinner will be held on Sunday, November 2, from 11:00-3:00 pm.


