**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR**

**Measure 1 Human Life Amendment**

There has been a lot of political rhetoric about the implications of the Human Life Amendment, officially known as Measure #1 on the ballot. There probably will be more. I admit that at first I was somewhat unsure as the amendment did seem rather simple. I have come to understand that the focus of the amendment is not making new laws but rather protecting pro-life laws that the legislature has passed. The argument that the courts could go overboard in protecting life such as preventing living wills seem superficial to me. It seems unlikely that the courts would move towards restricting individual rights such as deciding a person's choice of the means used to keep him or her alive beyond natural means of death. Even if the courts should ever go too far, it seems relatively simple to get the legislature to pass another constitutional amendment and have the people ratify it. The point of the amendment is to prevent lower courts from overturning laws that the legislature has made to restrict abortion rights, e.g., notification of parents before a child under eighteen could have an abortion. These laws seem to reflect the values of the majority of people in our state. The question it seems comes down to who has the right to make the final determination of the desire of the people. There will always be some tension between legislatures and courts. Courts usually take the role of emphasizing individual rights while legislatures emphasize the apparent will of the majority. One role of the Constitution is to express the values of a people as a whole, trying to provide a median between the relevant desires of a minority versus those of the majority. As I see it this the Human Life Amendment is an expression of the essential value that every human life has dignity and deserves respect at every stage of development.
