Holy Father's Prayer Intention for January 2013

General Intention: That in this Year of Faith Christians may deepen their knowledge of the mystery of Christ and witness joyfully to the gift of faith in him.
Missionary Intention: That the Christian communities of the Middle East, often discriminated against, may receive from the Holy Spirit the strength of fidelity and perseverance.

**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR
 CREED (cont.)**

The Creed moves directly from the Incarnation to the Paschal Mystery of Jesus. I am not sure why it skips over not just the hidden life of Jesus but also His public ministry. I suspect that if one were to start including other elements from the Gospels, it would get too long to be easily memorized. The Incarnation and the Redemption are the primary purpose for the Son of God to reveal Himself as Jesus. He has come to win us back to God by making the ultimate sacrifice so that we might be part of the unity of creation with God expressed in the Incarnation.

Perhaps the most important words of the Creed at this point are "for our sake". All the wonders of Creation and the sufferings of Jesus have one purpose. We have separated ourselves from God and continue to separate ourselves from Him by sin. Every day we make choices that lead us away from an intimate relationship with God. We fail to love God with everything that we have. We fail to love our neighbor as ourselves. Ironically, the closer to sainthood we come, the more aware we are of our failings. Not being aware of our weaknesses and failings simply is the blindness we impose on ourselves as we move away from God.

God worked a mighty wonder in becoming human. He worked great wonders in giving up everything for us. He did this simply to bring us home to Himself. We are encouraged to look at the crucifix to realize that this is the ultimate gift Jesus could give to us, to accept suffering and death. This is God's act of love, His invitation to us, to freely choose to respond with love for Him. The mysteries of Jesus' life and the Church are realities inviting us to faith. God wants us to love Him. He proclaims His forgiveness and His love and simply waits for us to say yes to Him.

January 2013 IRA charitable rollover contributions are deductible for 2012

Donors age 70½ or older are once again eligible to move up to \$100,000 from their IRAs directly to St. Agnes or other qualified ministry without having to pay income taxes on the money. Congress recognized the issues with a late extension and provided two special transition rules:

- 1) Qualified distributions made by Feb. 1, 2013, may be counted retroactively for the 2012 tax year.
- 2) A taxpayer who took a distribution from an IRA in December 2012 can make a contribution to a qualified charity before Feb. 1, 2013, and treat this as a direct transfer.
