**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR
CREED (cont.)**

HE SUFFERED DEATH AND WAS BURIED

The original translation of this was he suffered, died and was buried. It is not a major change but it appears to shift the emphasis. Our salvation lies primarily in the death of Jesus. As Christians we affirm that Jesus truly died. This is not as obvious as it might seem. There are some heresies in the history of the Church that could not accept the mystery of God dying. It appeared to be a contradiction to them. If Jesus is truly God then He should be immortal. In this view Jesus death on the cross was just an illusion. God fooled everyone by having His Son only appear to be suffering and dying. The implication of this would be that no real change would have happened in our world. We would still be burdened with our sins and have no hope of eternal life. If Jesus is going to unite us with the Father, it was necessary that he be one with us in every way. The one thing that is universal to all humanity as well as all creation is death. If Jesus truly was one of us, he had to die and be buried. Anything less and He would not have given up all His dignity in order to offer God's love to us in the gift of life.
