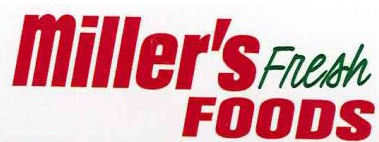

MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR CREED (cont.)

And rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures

The new translation of the missal includes this phrase as part of a larger sentence: "For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures." The old translation divided these thoughts into two sentences. Although a longer sentence would not ordinarily be proper English grammar, there is a purpose behind combining it into one sentence. The Church is reminding us that the death and the resurrection of Jesus are one event. The resurrection of Jesus would not have happened unless Jesus had died, and the death of Jesus would have no meaning without the resurrection. The death and the resurrection of Jesus are one mystery, the Paschal mystery.

The resurrection of Jesus is an essential belief for Christians. St. Paul said that if Jesus had not risen from the dead "then our preaching was in vain and your faith is in vain". Everything that Jesus is reported to have said and done in the Scriptures finds its meaning in the resurrection of Jesus. Our faith insists that these are historical events. Jesus truly was a human being who lived and died. But if that's all he was, we would not remember him. The resurrection of Jesus is a proof of the divinity of Jesus as well as his humanity. Because Jesus rose from the dead, we take seriously all his teachings.

The Catholic Catechism notes that the two aspects to the Paschal mystery are emphasized in this sentence. By his death Christ liberates us from sin, and by his resurrection he opens for us the way to new life. This new life is justification by which we along with all of humanity are restored to our proper relationship with God. Our failures to put God first in our life and to love our neighbor has and continues to create a separation between us and God. This separation is what we call sin and has brought about not just physical but spiritual death into our world. When Christ liberated us from sin giving us new life, he has made us into a holy people. Justification means to be made holy in God's eyes.

Because we have been justified by the resurrection of Jesus we have hope in for our own resurrection. Our purpose in living this life is to claim the gift of resurrection for ourselves. Jesus has won it for us, but we still have to accept it in our lives. The sacraments, prayer and Christian living are ways in which we are given the opportunity to make a choice in our life. We can say yes to God and choose life or we can continue to doubt God's love for us and remain in sin. The Paschal mystery of Jesus is God's invitation to us to choose life.

RICE BOWL

In the small West African nation of Burkina Faso, 80% of the population are farmers. Frequent droughts make it difficult to produce enough food for the entire year. Often, farmers can only grow enough to feed their families for seven months. The rest of the year is called "the hungry season." Another area having trouble is East Timor, where tuberculosis is a major health crisis. Catholic Relief Services Lenten Program works in communities where access to medical care is limited. This week we pray for the families in these areas and give to the Rice Bowl to help the people who are struggling with hunger and illness.

Safety Tips
