MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR CREED (cont.)

I believe in the Holy Spirit

We begin our focus on the third Person of the Blessed Trinity, the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is harder for us to describe because we have no easy analogy to comprehend him. We all have images of a father and of a son. Using those images we create in our minds an analogical picture of God the Father and God the Son. The danger with analogy is we may reduce the Father and the Son to the pictures we have in our mind. The Holy Spirit serves as a correction for us to remind us that God is way beyond anything we can imagine or understand. The Father and the Son have such love for each other that this love, this bond, this unity is a Person as well. The Holy Spirit is not a secondary Person. The Spirit of God is everything that the Father and the Son are but that the Spirit is neither the Father nor the Son, just as the Son is neither the Father nor the Son. These three Persons are so united that they are not three gods but the One God. As I said God is beyond our understanding or comprehension.

God chose to reveal Himself over a period of time. The first revelation was that God is One. Until God revealed Himself to Abraham and the Israelites the common belief was in many gods. People had a sense of spiritual power beyond themselves so they developed myths to explain the forces that occur in nature. There was always a tension. Somehow there had to be a unifying force so they would believe in a king of the gods like Zeus or Jupiter, yet they saw what appeared to be contradictory forces happening. The gift that Israel brings to the nations is the belief that God is above all the powers and principalities of the world. He brings a unifying force to the world, a plan that allows for evil to be conquered and put at the ultimate service of love and good.

When the time was right God chose to reveal Himself fully in Jesus. Jesus is the human being who is completely one with God. His human nature is united with the divine nature of God. In this unity He is the revelation, the perfect image of God. As the Son, He is sent to proclaim that God truly has conquered evil, even in its ultimate form of death. Jesus life, death and resurrection invite us into the kingdom of God where we will find the fullness of life.

To enable us to say yes to God, to accept the gift of life the Holy Spirit comes from the Father and the Son to form a community where we can experience the presence of Jesus and the Father. By the power of the Holy Spirit we become a member of the People of God, part of the Body of Christ. In our unity with the Body of Christ we are joined to Jesus. We become an adopted child of God, healed of all the wounds inflicted by our sins. As adopted children by the work of the Holy Spirit we join with Jesus to discover the wonder of our God in His fullness.
