

**Screening for Colorectal Cancer saves lives**

March is National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month. Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of cancer incidence in ND. Colorectal cancer accounts for 400 new cancer diagnoses and 140 people dying from the disease each year. This doesn't have to be! Colorectal cancer often can be prevented. Regular screening can find precancerous polyps so they can be removed before they turn into cancer and screening find colorectal cancer early, when treatment can be effective.

**Risk Factors**

- Family history of colorectal cancer
- Both men and women can get colorectal cancer
- Personal history of inflammatory bowel disease, including Crohn's Disease and ulcerative colitis.
- Risk increases with age

Colorectal cancer is most often found in people 50 or older

**Symptoms: you may not have any symptoms**

Blood in or on your stool (bowel movement)

Pain, aches, or cramps in your stomach that happen a lot and you don't know why

A change in bowel habits, such as having stools that are narrower than usual

Losing weight and you don't know why

Most insurance providers cover the following screening services for individuals age 50 and older:

- Screening Fecal Occult Blood Test (FOBT) every year,
- Screening Flexible Sigmoidoscopy once every 4 years (unless a screening colonoscopy has been performed and then Medicare may cover a screening sigmoidoscopy after at least 119 months),
- Screening Colonoscopy every 10 years (unless a screening flexible sigmoidoscopy has been performed and then Medicare may cover a screening colonoscopy only after at least 47 months), and
- Screening Barium Enema (as an alternative to a covered screening flexible sigmoidoscopy).

Screening and early detection saves lives. Talk to your insurance provider and take advantage of colorectal cancer screening services they cover. Other ways to reduce the risk for colorectal cancer include not smoking, maintaining a healthy weight, exercising, eating less red meat, and consuming alcohol in moderation or not at all.

**MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR**

**HAPPY EASTER**

Today we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus. This is the most important feast of our Christian faith. Not only do we believe that Jesus has died and is risen, but that He has led the way to eternal life for us. Resurrection is not an easy doctrine to believe in. We do not frequently see a dead man brought to life. Our hope and confidence in the Resurrection is supported by the experience of the disciples of Jesus. After Good Friday they were demoralized and probably had fled to back to Galilee. Suddenly as St. Paul reports, they had experiences that Jesus was alive. The Gospel stories affirm that these experiences were challenging. They knew He was not a ghost or demon. He would eat with them and invite them to touch Him. Yet He had the power to appear and disappear suddenly and locked doors had no effect on Him.



There are many doubters beginning with St. Thomas who remain unconvinced. All we can do is take the word of witnesses who had their lives changed by their experience of the risen Jesus. Belief in the Resurrection is a gift. It reminds us that there are more important things than this world. The Resurrection of Jesus is the promise that God will one day raise us up as well. He begins to give us the promise of life in our experiences of Him in prayer and in the sacraments. The hope of a new life is a gift of freedom. Those things that hold us back in this life, lack of money, powerlessness, the drudgery of suffering and pain will one day be overcome. We will see God face to face and discover the true joy and excitement that only He can give to us. So let us truly rejoice this Easter for Jesus has risen and we are alive.

Did you like the Haroseth at the Seder Meal? Some of you asked for the recipe to try at home ... it is really good on your oatmeal! Enjoy!

HAROSETH - symbolizes the mixture of straw and mud that the bricks were made of by slaves to build Pharaoh's city.  
 Bring to a simmer in a medium pot:  
 6 apples, skin on and chopped (like the size of the raisins)  
 1 cup raisins  
 1/2 cup slivered almonds  
 1 tablespoon cinnamon  
 1 cup brown sugar  
 Simmer for about 10 minutes to soften the apples. Cool and put in fridge.
