

May is Stroke Awareness Month

Every 40 seconds, someone in the United States has a stroke. It is the fourth leading cause of death and the leading cause of adult disability. Stroke is a medical emergency. The timely evaluation and treatment of stroke can minimize long-term neurological disabilities. If treated within three hours of the first symptom, the effects of stroke can be greatly reduced. Use FAST to remember the warning signs of stroke:

- **Face** droops on one side: Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop?
- **Arms** drift downward when raised: Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?
- **Speech** is slurred: Ask the person to repeat a simple phrase. Is their speech slurred or strange?

Time is critical: If you observe any of these signs, call 9-1-1 immediately.

MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

CREED (cont.)

I believe in the Holy Spirit (Name, Titles, Symbols)

Before Easter I had started writing about the Holy Spirit and the symbols associated with the Holy Spirit. It seems especially appropriate to discuss this now as we are in the season of Confirmation with children from Our Lady of Peace about to be confirmed at Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Reynolds next Saturday and Jack Thompson confirmed at St. Catherine in Valley City last Sunday.

There are two ritual actions that happen in Confirmation. One is the laying on of hands. This may be done either with a direct placing of hands on the head of each candidate or in larger groups with a general stretching out of the hands over the group. A similar action happens at every Mass when the priest stretches his hands over the bread and wine about to be consecrated. This is called an *epiclesis*. It is a prayer asking God to send His Holy Spirit down upon the elements or the persons so that He might transform them and bring them into union with His Son, the Risen Jesus.

The second ritual action is the anointing with Chrism oil. Chrism oil is olive oil that has been mixed with a mixture of flower petals to give it a perfume scent and blessed by the bishop at the annual Chrism Mass during Holy Week. The priest delegated to act in the name of the bishop places the oil on the forehead of the person to be confirmed. The celebrant says to the candidate: "*Name*, be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit. Peace be with you."

By being sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit the candidate has now fully entered into the priesthood of Christ. Those confirmed are now truly priests, prophets and kings with Christ. Each one of us by being a fully initiated Christian are called to be a people at the service of one another and the world. We have heard the command to love one another as Jesus has loved us. We have been bestowed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit so that we can bring Jesus to the world just as He has been brought to us. With the gifts and fruits of the Spirit we are being brought into the sanctuary of God and promised the gift of eternal life with God. All this will happen by the working of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

About two months ago I had to approach the parish and inform you that our income was not meeting our expenses. Since that time you have responded wonderfully. Our income has surpassed last year's level and we are now meeting our budget. I greatly appreciate the extra sacrifice that everyone. I am sure that God will bless you many times over for the extra effort. Flowing out of that request of two months ago some parishioners have approached me with a plan to finish off the debt.

They feel it is a burden that tends to hold us back from considering other needs of the church. They are offering a challenge pledge of \$4400 if other members of the parish will make a special contribution to pay off the rest of the debt by June 30. This would be a contribution over and above the regular parish offering. Our debt as of January was about \$9900. Since that time about \$3800 has been contributed to the building fund.

To earn that challenge pledge the rest of the parish would need to provide a combined total of about \$2000. This seems like it would be doable and I think it would give the parish a feeling of accomplishment to know that the debt has been finally taken care of. Again I thank you for your generosity to the parish. It makes my life a lot easier trying to be a responsible steward of Our Lady of Peace.
