MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

For much of the past year I have been talking about various aspects of the first half of the Mass. The first half of the Mass is entitled the Liturgy of the Word. I spent a number of weeks the articles of the Creed. Now we are going to put our focus on the second half of the Mass which is called the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Liturgy of the Eucharist is a commemoration of the events whereby Christ instituted the Paschal sacrifice and banquet at the Last Supper. This commemoration is not just a historical memory but rather a continuously making present of the Sacrifice of the Cross. The priest, representing Christ the Lord, carries out with the Lord himself did and handed over to his disciples to be done in his memory. The essential elements of Christ's action are his taking the bread and the chalice, giving thanks breaking the bread and giving it to his disciples saying: take, eat and drink: this is my Body; this is the chalice of my Blood. Do this in memory of me.

There are three major parts to the liturgy of the Eucharist. At the preparation of the gifts, bread and wine with water are brought to the altar. In the Eucharistic prayer, thanks is given to God for the whole work of salvation, and the offerings become the body and blood of Christ. Through the breaking of the bread and through communion, the faithful, though many received from the one bread the Lord's body and from the one chalice the Lord's blood in the same way that the apostles receive them from the hands of Christ himself.

Note that much of the above is a paraphrase of the General Instruction to the Mass. In future message as I want to go into more depth into the meaning of these actions and the words that have been used. At those times I will also make comments about some of the changes in the translation.

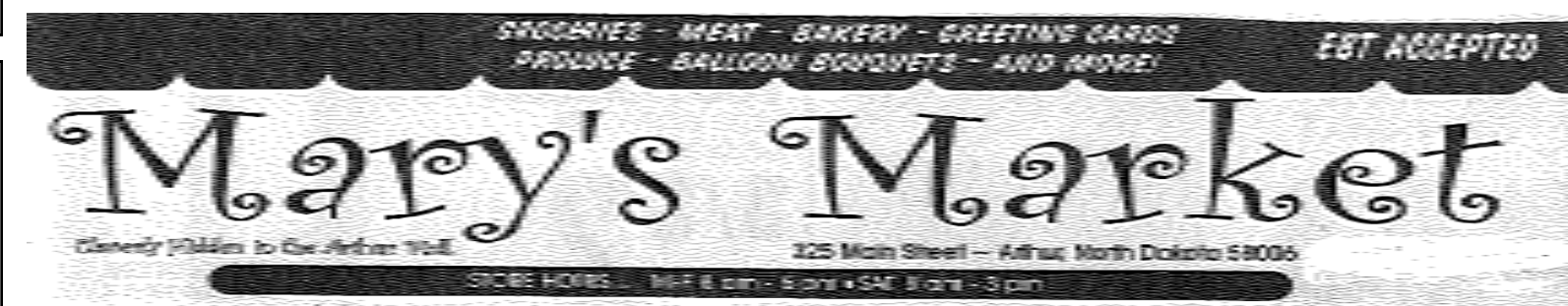
